Wills and Trusts

Wills and Trusts are the most common way for people to provide for their favorite charities. This method allows for you to retain full use of your assets during your life. Many find that leaving a small portion of their estates (for example 10%) enables them to provide for their loved ones' needs and to support those causes important to them. To make a bequest gift, select one of the two KFL entities, and ask your attorney to include the following paragraph:

I give, devise and bequeath to Kansans for Life, Inc or to Kansans for Life Educational Trust Fund, a non-profit corporation, with its principal office located at 3301 W 13th St N, Wichita, KS 67203, the sum of \$_____ or _____ % of my estate (or describe another type of gift).

You can also make gifts directly to a charity from your I.R.A. account after you are 70 ½ years of age. Ask your lawyer about an IRA Charity Rollover.
