


I'm a Kansan for Life!

I had just lost my husband to cancer and just as so many people had impacted me in my deep time of need, I was looking for a place to serve others and make a difference in their lives. Soon after starting, I began training in sonography and was certified in 2012. I later came on staff full time as Volunteer Team Coordinator and then as Director. I love seeing lives changed at Choices. Women come in fearful, confused and hopeless. We share Christ, love them, pray for them and show them their baby, and we see the Lord change them from the inside out! It's deeply fulfilling and rewarding.
