How I became involved in the pro-life movement:

My grandmother was a Jewish survivor of the Holocaust and helped start the pro-life movement in Kansas back in 1970. My parents, siblings, and I began participating in the Wichita pro-life movement in 1988. My dad printed little signs for us to hang around our necks, "I'm so glad to be alive!" He'd take us down to one of the three abortion clinics in Wichita every Saturday morning for a couple of hours to stand next to the driveway with our signs.

Additionally, we kids loved volunteering at the KFL office! We participated in KFL art contests, attended annual KFL picnics, and even sang at KFL events. We also volunteered for dozens of pro-life candidates' campaigns in local, state, and national elections. We wore pro-life t-shirts often and put pro-life bumper stickers on our cars, and participated in the annual Life Chain Sunday.

Eventually, my parents had a total of 12 kids! No doubt, we are a pro-life family! My dad always joked that he only wanted two kids, but that he never got the two he wanted!

Over the years, we siblings continued to go out to pray and hold signs at Tiller's clinic. We'd attend prayer vigils and rallies. In 1997, we helped with the city-wide effort "God Goes Back to the Schools," joining dozens of other volunteers to hold pro-life signs and pass out literature at all the Wichita high schools.

What I do for the pro-life movement:

For five years now, I have enjoyed working for Kansans for Life. Initially, I served as the Secretary of the KFL Political Action Committee, and I now serve as an office assistant and the Director of Latino Outreach. I've enjoyed traveling throughout the state speaking to Hispanic churches and groups. I still participate in sidewalk counseling at a local abortion clinic once a week.

Jesus said in John 10:10, "I have come that they might have life, and that they might have it more abundantly." Not only am I thankful for God's gift of physical life, but I'm so thankful that Jesus gave up His life that we might have eternal life. I'm proud to be part of an organization like KFL that is dedicated to defending, protecting, and promoting God's gift of life.
