Kansans for Life (KFL) engaged Heart+Mind Strategies to conduct a survey of Kansas registered voters to assess current attitudes on a number of topics. A representative, statewide survey of 610 registered voters was conducted 24 March to 3 April 2023.

The survey included a specific question to assess Kansans’ attitudes on babies surviving an attempted abortion and the level of agreement that babies born in this situation should or should not receive medical care appropriate to the baby’s gestational age.

The data on this subject is unequivocal.

Fully 96% of Kansas registered voters agree that babies should receive medical care. Every subgroup examined in the study shows a super-majority agreement with providing medical care, including those who self-declare themselves as “Pro-Choice” (95% agree). Interestingly, there is only a four percentage point difference with those who identify as “Pro-Life”, with 99% in agreement.

Analysis shows there are high levels of agreement regardless of gender, age, region of the state, media market, party identification, ideology, or voters’ support on the August 2022 amendment on abortion. All groups overwhelmingly agree that if a baby survives an attempted abortion, the child should receive appropriate medical care.

The subgroup results of the survey demonstrates that even Pro-Choice voter groups almost unanimously agree with providing appropriate medical care:
